The Laws of Koyanagar

Established on the 20th of December, 2041

- 1. Every person shall be treated equally, regardless of age, gender or economic status.
- 2. Koyanagar shall be governed by a State Council, which shall consist of eleven persons, including one President. Should a member of the Council depart this life, a new member shall be chosen by those remaining.
- 3. Koyanagar shall not acknowledge the existence of divine beings, nor shall its people be permitted to worship or act in the name of such beings.
- 4. No person or thing (including, but not limited to, both tangible and non-tangible items such as electronic communications and messaging) shall enter or exit Koyanagar without written consent from the State Council.
- 5. The use of technology to determine, influence or select the gender of a future person is strictly prohibited.
- 6. In keeping with the Love Your Daughters campaign, all mothers shall be rewarded 1000 yira per month for every daughter—married or unmarried—in her household. In the event that the ratio of marriageable boys to girls is equalized, the State Council reserves the right to cease these endowments.
- 7 a. No person shall enter into, or agree to enter into, a marriage outside of the Tests.
- 7 b. Each female person shall participate in the Tests when she reaches 17 years of age. Her five contestants shall be randomly selected from all boys in the Registry who are between 15 and 18 years of age and who have not previously competed in the Tests. The chosen boys shall complete five Tests over a period of three days. The boy with the most points shall be granted the girl's hand in marriage. If a boy does not win the Tests, or if he is not selected to compete in them before he reaches 18 years of age, he will be sent to the Assignment Center where he will be given a residence and occupation. If no suitable occupation is available for him, he will be assigned a position in the Koyanagar Army.
- 8. Any person who defies the above laws shall be subject to a punishment determined by the State Council.
